How it all began ...

There's not a single one of us who doesn't know someone who may be facing hunger. For 27 years Manna of Life Ministries has served the Bronx community by feeding the body and the spirit.

Our story began in 1995 when two brothers, Erbin Cobian and his brother Victor Andujar, were volunteers at a soup kitchen. While volunteering at the soup kitchen, Erbin saw a friend he had known during his teenage years. His name was Skippy. Skippy was dressed in rags and looked needy and neglected. Skippy came to get a meal. Erbin's heart ached with sympathy and sadness for Skippy. He was struck with so much emotion that he had to walk away before Skippy recognized him and let his brother serve him. That night, Erbin prayed to GOD for answers. He wanted to help Skippy but was not sure what to do.

The following day, Erbin, excited to see Skippy again, gave him a bag of clothes which he had packed from his own closet. Erbin then offered to drop Skippy home. Skippy asked to be dropped off at the corner of Bruckner Boulevard and Erbin insisted on dropping him off in front of his house. After driving around for a while, Skippy finally confessed that he was homeless and slept under a bridge in Hunts Point.

Erbin went home that night compelled to reduce Skippy's suffering and so he cried out to GOD once again on what to do. There were other questions too: How many more were there in Skippy's situation? How many more needed food, shelter and real love? Did GOD want to use him in this type of ministry? He was just one person; he would need help.

It turned out that God was calling him and sending help. On an early Saturday morning at a men's breakfast fellowship at Crossroads Tabernacle, in October of 1995, Erbin approached his brother Victor, Joe Ziel and a young man named John about his experience with Skippy. He expressed to them a need to do something about feeding those in need, specifically the homeless. The group began to brainstorm on how they could accomplish this.

It began with providing food for the hungry twice a week but they quickly realized that it wasn't enough. They decided to include Saturdays in hopes to reach more of the 'lost' and reveal God's love for them, and so, the Saturday runs began. Erbin and John would go out on mobile runs with juices and sandwiches to feed the homeless of Hunts point. They followed God's guidance and prayed that their effort would have a positive impact on the people they reached. Their calling to help the 'lost' urged them to do more and GOD provided someone who informed them of a place under a bridge where many homeless resided. They visited the place and met a woman living there named Gloria who told them they called their home the 'black hole'.

Erbin, Victor, Joe and John never thought this simple act of love and faith into action would propel into a ministry that would touch thousands of people in need and also be a valuable community resource. As need grows and word spreads, we thank GOD for his continued blessings in helping us serve and develop relationships with those who believe in our vision to feed the spirit and eliminate hunger throughout the Bronx.



Our Timeline

- 1995** • Ministry was born as a response to the pressing human need of hunger and of “Love’.
- 38 turkey dinners were shared with the community (precursor to our “Adopt A Family” campaign).
- 1998** • Manna of Life Ministries becomes officially incorporated as a 501 (c) 3 non-profit.
- First Toy Drive organized.
- 1999** • First Coat Drive organized.
- 2000** • First fundraising Gala to support the vision.
- 2003** • Received our first Grant from United Way that allowed Manna to open our food pantry at Crossroads Tabernacle
- 2005** • Manna begins shelter outreach to families and children providing toys, clothes and other essential needs.
- 2007** • Manna begins to distribute pantry bags of Thanksgiving meals complete with turkeys and all the fixings to impoverished families, in addition to pantry staples.
- 2008** • Manna started distributing toys to the Bronx schools in need.
- 2010** • “Adopt A Family” campaign begins.
- 2015** • Divine Light Church enters in an agreement with Manna of Life Ministries which allows Manna to use the church to run a pantry and a soup kitchen.
- 2021** • Jardin De Esperanza (Garden of Hope) was inaugurated. The garden has become more than just a garden but a symbol of “hope and beauty” in the community.
- 2022** • We held many events that brought our post-Covid-19 community together: holiday toy drive, annual coat drive, Easter celebration, Garden of Hope planting, monthly cooking demonstrations with Chef Ili, Mother’s Day celebration, Firefighters For Christ visit, Father’s Day celebration, BronxCare Health System mobile health unit visit, Back to School backpack giveaways, and more.

He also has been employed as a full-time chaplain/activities director to 500 dual diagnosed male residents in the Bowery, hospital assistant psychiatric social worker, high-risk intervention high school counselor and special-education school social worker (recently retired). Currently he is transitioning to innovating art therapy flavored activities supportive of non profit organizations and hurting demographics. His first published children book (Peanut Butter and a Little Extra Kindness) mirrors the beginnings of Manna of Life ministry, to which all his royalties are donated to. Writers that have inspired him include Calvin Miller and Shel Silverstein. Jeffrey loves doodling, dry humor, and any work with redemptive narratives. His favorite saying is "You're in The Way or you're in the way".

Mary Ann Durden Cortez



Born and reared in Florida Mary Ann Durden Cortez is married to the most wonderful man in the world (whom she's allowed to proofread and edit her writing). She's the mother of three sharp young women, grandmother to three hilarious grandkids and mother-in-law to a Godly man and physician. She's been a High School substance abuse intervention counselor in the Bronx for the past 30 years in an area where many thought she wouldn't last one week. She has been a mentor to many high risk teens that have not only completed their high school, but also completed higher education and are currently professionals. Mary loves devotionals, word games and challenging activities. She loves trouble and getting involved in empowering hopeless cases. One example is how she prayerfully advocated and successfully arranged for a devastated student to come live in their own household as a foster child. The former foster child has been gainfully employed over past several years as a New York State masters level counselor. Manna of Life has been a wonderful resource assisting Mary's high school students and their families. Mary's favorite saying is "I can do all things in through Christ who strengthens me".



Michelle Caruso-Cabrera



Michelle Caruso-Cabrera began her career at Univisión Spanish-language news, where she produced stories relevant to the immigrant experience. In 1993, she received an Emmy for a series she co-produced, Orphans of the AIDS Crisis, and in 1998 she joined CNBC, the world's premiere business news network, where she became a top anchor and the network's first Chief International Correspondent. Michelle specialized in covering economic crises, and the impact of government policy on economic development.

In 2018, she became one of the first Latinas in the country to be invited to join the board of a large public financial institution, where she oversaw and helped manage the launch of the institution's rebranding during her 2-year tenure.

Michelle's love of NYC led her to run for elected office. She was the top Latino vote getter citywide in the June 2021 primary, in which she ran for city comptroller. She also ran against Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez in the Democratic primary in June 2020. Michelle's passion for New Yorkers also motivates her to give back to her community, through her volunteer work and support of Manna of Life Ministries, and through serving as President of the Board of Directors of Ballet Hispánico.

Pastor Raymond Serrano



Pastor Raymond Serrano along with his wife Pastor Persis Serrano are the founding Pastors of Life Together Fellowship in the Castle Hill area of the Bronx, New York.

Born and raised in The Bronx, Pastor Ray has earned a Bachelor's degree in Pastoral Ministry from Nyack College and has been serving in full time ministry for the past 26 years. He has served as the director of the Care Ministry at Crossroads Tabernacle, and the Administrative Pastor at Harvest Field Community Church, before the Lord led him to plant "Life Together Fellowship" in 2010 with his beautiful wife Pastor Persis Serrano and twelve other brothers and sisters in Christ.

In 2020, Pastor Ray founded Life Together Works NYC, a non-profit organization which serves the community with free services such as: a community garden, weekly food pantry, senior citizen nutrition classes, movie afternoons and the LTWorks NYC: School of the Arts which offers children with free music lessons.

Pastor Ray has served as Regional Director for the Elim Fellowship Metro New York/North Jersey Region, Board President of Didasko Christians Association and currently as Founder and Executive Director of Life Together Works NYC.

Pastor Ray is happily married for over 36 years. And has been blessed with three children, all young adults today, Justin Michael, Joseph Matthew and Brittney Lauren.

I'm a native of New York City, born and raised in East (Spanish) Harlem until the age of 31. I currently live in the Bronx for the last 28 years. I am a graduate of "The City College of New York" with a "Bachelor of Arts in Sociology" concentrating in "Urban Deviance and Criminology" since 1990. Currently retired from the New York City Department of Correction as a Correction Officer for 24 1/2 years from 1991 to 2016.

Attended Crossroads Tabernacle Church in the Bronx since 1994 to 2016. HERE IS WHAT WE HAVE...our 16-passenger van, pictured here, has reached the end of its life and is no longer repairable. We bought it used back in 2005, and it now has over 150,000 miles on the odometer. It has been a vital part of Manna of Life Ministries, providing transportation for our community outreaches, transport of staff and volunteers, food and supplies pick-ups, deliveries for our homebound clients and soup kitchen pop-ups at various heavily populated homeless locations throughout the city.

We are looking preferably for a multi-purpose minibus, similar to what is pictured below.

It would replace our non-operative van, which was a much needed and important part of Manna’s operation. Though Manna of Life has a number of needs this we believe is our most pressing need and consider it the focus of our gala fundraising efforts. The cost would be approximately \$60,000.

Whereas, Manna of Life Ministries, Inc. is a vital and valuable nonprofit organization dedicated to serving the homeless and destitute. Its work has saved and improved countless lives across the Bronx, New York, and beyond; and

Whereas, Manna of Life Ministries, Inc. assists in meeting the needs of disenfranchised members of the community by feeding, clothing, educating and empowering. It offers services including traditional and mobile Soup Kitchens and Food Pantries, a Homeless Shelter Outreach program, a Life Skills Program and a Community Referral Program; and
