How it all began ...

There's not a single one of us who doesn't know someone who may be facing hunger. For 28 years Manna of Life Ministries has served the Bronx community by feeding the body and the spirit.

Our story began in 1995 when two brothers, Erbin Cobian and his brother Victor Andujar, were volunteers at a soup kitchen. While volunteering at the soup kitchen, Erbin saw a friend he had known during his teenage years. His name was Skippy. Skippy was dressed in rags and looked needy and neglected. Skippy came to get a meal. Erbin's heart ached with sympathy and sadness for Skippy. He was struck with so much emotion that he had to walk away before Skippy recognized him and let his brother serve him. That night, Erbin prayed to GOD for answers. He wanted to help Skippy but was not sure what to do.

The following day, Erbin, excited to see Skippy again, gave him a bag of clothes which he had packed from his own closet. Erbin then offered to drop Skippy home. Skippy asked to be dropped off at the corner of Bruckner Boulevard and Erbin insisted on dropping him off in front of his house. After driving around for a while, Skippy finally confessed that he was homeless and slept under a bridge in Hunts Point.

Erbin went home that night compelled to reduce Skippy's suffering and so he cried out to GOD once again on what to do. There were other questions too: How many more were there in Skippy's situation? How many more needed food, shelter and real love? Did GOD want to use him in this type of ministry? He was just one person; he would need help.

It turned out that God was calling him and sending help. On an early Saturday morning at a men's breakfast fellowship at Crossroads Tabernacle, in October of 1995, Erbin approached his brother Victor, Joe Ziel and a young man named John about his experience with Skippy. He expressed to them a need to do something about feeding those in need, specifically the homeless. The group began to brainstorm on how they could accomplish this.

It began with providing food for the hungry twice a week but they quickly realized that it wasn't enough. They decided to include Saturdays in hopes to reach more of the 'lost' and reveal God's love for them, and so, the Saturday runs began. Erbin and John would go out on mobile runs with juices and sandwiches to feed the homeless of Hunts point. They followed God's guidance and prayed that their effort would have a positive impact on the people they reached. Their calling to help the 'lost' urged them to do more and GOD provided someone who informed them of a place under a bridge where many homeless resided. They visited the place and met a woman living there named Gloria who told them they called their home the 'black hole'.

Erbin, Victor, Joe and John never thought this simple act of love and faith into action would propel into a ministry that would touch thousands of people in need and also be a valuable community resource. As need grows and word spreads, we thank GOD for his continued blessings in helping us serve and develop relationships with those who believe in our vision to feed the spirit and eliminate hunger throughout the Bronx.



Our Timeline

1995	Ministry was born as a response to the pressing human need of hunger and of "Love".
(38 turkey dinners were shared with the community (precursor to our "Adopt A Family" campaign).
1998	Manna of Life Ministries becomes officially incorporated as a 501 (c) 3 non-profit.
(First Toy Drive organized.
1999	First Coat Drive organized.
2000	First fundraising Gala to support the vision.
2003	Received our first Grant from United Way that allowed Manna to open our food pantry at Crossroads Tabernacle
2005	Manna begins shelter outreach to families and children providing toys, clothes and other essential needs.
2007	Manna begins to distribute pantry bags of Thanksgiving meals complete with turkeys and all the fixings to impoverished families, in addition to pantry staples.
2008	Manna started distributing toys to the Bronx schools in need.
2010	"Adopt A Family" campaign begins.
2015	Divine Light Church enters in an agreement with Manna of Life Ministries which allows Manna to use the church to run a pantry and a soup kitchen.
2021	Jardin De Esperanza (Garden of Hope) was inaugurated. The garden has become more than just a garden but a symbol of "hope and beauty" in the community.
2023	We held many events that brought our Bronx community together: Adopt-a-Family, holiday toy drive, annual coat drive, Easter celebration, Garden of Hope planting, monthly cooking demonstrations with Chef ili, Mother's Day celebration, Father's Day celebration, Garden of Hope Event, BronxCare Health System mobile health unit visit, Back to School backpack giveaways, and more.



Honoree Bio

Bishop Raymond Rivera "Faith and Justice Walk Together"

Since the age of 19, Bishop Raymond Rivera has been serving our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, as a pastor, preacher, denominational executive, organization founder, community builder, social justice advocate, bishop, and founder and overseer of churches and ministries. Throughout this time, he has preached, taught, and modeled Christ-centered holistic ministry, particularly in an urban context. His theological framework is Ministering in a Situation of Captivity™, based on the Old Testament lessons of the people of Israel.

His program methodology is centered on the Latino Pastoral Action Center's (LPAC's) Four Principles of Holistic Ministry™: Liberation, Healing, Community, and Transformation. Ultimately, he strives to strengthen the Four Pillars of Community Life™: Families, Schools, Community-Based Organizations, and Churches.

Bishop Rivera has been a teacher, a keynote speaker, and a lecturer at seminaries and universities, such as Union



Theological Seminary, Princeton Theological Seminary, Alliance Theological Seminary, Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, and Yale. He has received many honors and awards for his community, activism, and ministerial work, among them two honorary doctoral degrees. He served as a voice to former New York State Governor Cuomo and the New York City Mayor's Clergy Advisory Committee. Currently he is Board Chairman of the National Latino Evangelical Coalition (NaLEC), and Co-Convener of the MICAH Faith Table, NYC (an interfaith social justice organization.)

Bishop Rivera is the author of a book entitled "Liberty to the Captives: Our Call to Minister in a Captive World," published by Eerdmans Publishing. Several seminaries use his book in urban ministry and practical theology programs. The book will be available in Spanish in 2022. He is currently working on a second book. He spends most of his time preparing the next and future generations to carry out his vision of holistic ministry and social justice engagement.

Bishop Rivera lives in the Bronx with his wife, Dr. Marilyn Calo with their blended family, they have five children, Esteban, Susana, Joel, Stacy, and Adam, and seven grandchildren. His children and grandchildren participate in ministry. His daughter Reverend Susana Rivera León is charting his legacy and following him with the holistic approach to community-based ministry as the Senior Pastor at Sanctuary Church.






