LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

October 25, 2025

Dear Manna Family and Friends,

As President of Manna of Life Ministries, it is my profound honor to welcome you to this Benefit celebration— a joyful milestone marking **30 years of hope, compassion, and divine provision** in the Bronx. What began in 1995 with a handful of devoted souls handing out sandwiches has blossomed into a lifeline for generations, sustained solely by the generosity of strangers who trusted our mission before they ever saw it.

These 30 years have taught me that **God always comes in at the 11th hour**. I've also learned this: God has my back, this organization's back, and we are His children. Through every challenge, from pandemics to funding cliffs, He has never abandoned us.

The COVID-19 pandemic laid bare our community's vulnerability. Lines stretched farther than ever as neighbors sought food, while homebound seniors and quarantined families faced isolation. Thanks to our heroic staff and volunteers (who refused to close our doors even during lockdowns), we delivered nourishment to those who couldn't reach us. Government aid provided temporary relief, but when it ended, our commitment did not.

In 2024, with just three staff members and a core of over 15 dedicated volunteers, we distributed more than \$2 million worth of food to 152,000 Bronx residents — representing roughly 10% of the borough's population. This extraordinary efficiency is a testament to 30 years of responsible stewardship and the community trust you've helped us build.



The need persists, and our work intensifies as we head into the season that tests every family's resilience. Next month, our Adopt-A-Family campaign will support hundreds of Bronx families who need extra assistance during the holidays. Then comes the joy of our Christmas and Three Kings Day toy distributions: watching children's faces light up reminds us why we do this work. These programs stretch our resources, but they also stretch our hearts and deepen our impact in ways that food programs alone cannot.

I invite you to join our mission as **a monthly donor**, ensuring Manna's food pantry remains open, its stoves stay warm, and its doors are welcoming to all, regardless of religion, gender, or circumstance. Your recurring gift is the steady stream that outlasts even the substantial momentary downpours.



To our faithful donors, sponsors, staff, volunteers, ministry partners, and visionary Board: you are why we exist. Strangers who gave before they knew us. Volunteers who serve before dawn. Partners who amplify our reach. For 30 years, you have been God's hands and feet in the Bronx.

HOW IT ALL BEGAN...

There's not a single one of us who doesn't know someone who may be facing hunger. For 30 years Manna of Life Ministries has served the Bronx community by feeding the body and the spirit.

Our story began in 1995 when two brothers, Erbin Cobian and his brother Victor Andujar, were volunteers at a soup kitchen. While volunteering at the soup kitchen, Erbin saw a friend he had known during his teenage years. His name was Skippy. Skippy was dressed in rags and looked needy and neglected. Skippy came to get a meal. Erbin's heart ached with sympathy and sadness for Skippy. He was struck with so much emotion that he had to walk away before Skippy recognized him and let his brother serve him. That night, Erbin prayed to GOD for answers. He wanted to help Skippy but was not sure what to do.

The following day, Erbin, excited to see Skippy again, gave him a bag of clothes which he had packed from his own closet. Erbin then offered to drop Skippy home. Skippy asked to be dropped off at the corner of Bruckner Boulevard and Erbin insisted on dropping him off in front of his house. After driving around for a while, Skippy finally confessed that he was homeless and slept under a bridge in Hunts Point.

Erbin went home that night compelled to reduce Skippy's suffering and so he cried out to GOD once again on what to do. There were other questions too: How many more were there in Skippy's situation? How many more needed food, shelter and real love? Did GOD want to use him in this type of ministry? He was just one person; he would need help.

It turned out that God was calling him and sending help. On an early Saturday morning at a men's breakfast fellowship at Crossroads Tabernacle, in October of 1995, Erbin approached his brother Victor, Joe Ziel and a young man named John about his experience with Skippy. He expressed to them a need to do something about feeding those in need, specifically the homeless. The group began to brainstorm on how they could accomplish this.

It began with providing food for the hungry twice a week but they quickly realized that it wasn't enough. They decided to include Saturdays in hopes to reach more of the 'lost' and reveal God's love for them, and so, the Saturday runs began. Erbin and John would go out on mobile runs with juices and sandwiches to feed the homeless of Hunts point. They followed God's guidance and prayed that their effort would have a positive impact on the people they reached. Their calling to help the 'lost' urged them to do more and GOD provided someone who informed them of a place under a bridge where many homeless resided. They visited the place and met a woman living there named Gloria who told them they called their home the 'black hole'.

Erbin, Victor, Joe and John never thought this simple act of love and faith into action would propel into a ministry that would touch thousands of people in need and also be a valuable community resource. As need grows and word spreads, we thank GOD for his continued blessings in helping us serve and develop relationships with those who believe in our vision to feed the spirit and eliminate hunger throughout the Bronx.

1999	•	First Coat Drive organized.
2000	•	First fundraising Gala to support the vision.
2003	•	Received our first Grant from United Way that allowed Manna to open our food pantry at Crossroads Tabernacle
2005		Manna begins shelter outreach to families and children providing toys, clothes and other essential needs.
2007	•	Manna begins to distribute pantry bags of Thanksgiving meals complete with turkeys and all the fixings to impoverished families, in addition to pantry staples.
2008	•	Manna started distributing toys to the Bronx schools in need.
2010	•	"Adopt A Family" campaign begins.
2015	•	Divine Light Church enters in an agreement with Manna of Life Ministries which allows Manna to use the church to run a pantry and a soup kitchen.
2021	•	Jardin De Esperanza (Garden of Hope) was inaugurated. The garden has become more than just a garden but a symbol of "hope and beauty" in the community.
2023		We held many events that brought our Bronx community together: Adopt-a-Family, holiday toy drive, annual coat drive, Easter celebration, Garden of Hope planting, monthly cooking demonstrations with Chef ili, Mother's Day celebration, Father's Day celebration, Garden of Hope Event, BronxCare Health System mobile health unit visit, Back to School backpack giveaways, and more.



The author's royalties for this book will be donated to a Bronx-based nonprofit organization Manna of Life that has been serving our communities.




'Bev's Charity Crafting Neighborhood'!

IN MEMORIAM



On May 12, 2025, we lost a beloved member of our Manna of Life family and the Bronx community. Jose Collazo passed away at 64, after facing cancer with the same quiet strength that defined his life of service. As a founding member of our organization, board member, and spiritual leader, Jose touched countless lives with his genuine care and dedication.

Throughout his two decades of service with the NYPD (1984-2005), Jose worked tirelessly to build bridges between police and young people in the Bronx. He started as a rookie in the 30th Precinct, retired from the 41st Precinct, and found his true calling in Community Affairs. His work with SPECDA and DARE programs helped countless students avoid the dangers of drug abuse. Jose's role with the Police Athletic League (PAL) Liaison Unit created lasting connections between officers and neighborhood youth. Following their father's example of service, his son joined the force and became a detective, and his daughter a nurse.



When New York faced its darkest day on September 11, 2001, Jose joined fellow first responders in the search and recovery efforts at Ground Zero, showing the same selfless courage that marked his entire career.

At Manna of Life, Jose brought the same dedication he showed as an officer. A devoted member of Crossroads Tabernacle Church and its Board of Trustees, he lived his faith through service across multiple community organizations. Whether offering spiritual guidance, volunteering at outreach events, or serving on the board, he approached every task with humility and his characteristic warm smile. Those who worked alongside him remember his humor and ability to lift spirits, even during challenging times.

Jose's quiet strength came from his deep faith and belief in people's potential. He saw hope where others saw obstacles, particularly in the young people he mentored. His work was never about recognition but making life better for his beloved Bronx community, one person at a time.

He leaves behind his wife Maria, his daughter Melisa, son Jose, stepsons Manny and Willie, and fourteen grandchildren who brought immeasurable joy to his life. While our hearts ache with his loss, we find comfort knowing his legacy lives on through his family and the countless lives he touched.

Honoring Jose means continuing his work: serving others, believing in the power of community, and facing challenges with faith and courage. His light continues to shine through all those he inspired.

Rest in peace, dear friend. The Bronx is better because you called it home.










